

## How to Write a Short Academic Essay in the Social Sciences Workshop

*Description:* This workshop examines the basic structure of an academic essay for social sciences: Introduction, Argument, Counter-Argument, and Conclusion. It also covers in detail how to achieve the minimum requirements for academic writing. The goals are: 1) describe the objective of an Academic Essay, 2) elaborate a significant and plausible thesis, 2) structure the argument of the thesis, and 3) highlight the significant role of counter arguments.
