PROPHET MUHAMMAD HONORED BY US SUPREME COURT IN 1935 as a source of law and justice alongside Moses, Solomon, and Confucius. He is depicted in the Courtroom Frieze among the great law-givers of mankind (<http://www.supremecourt.gov/about/north&southwalls.pdf>).

This documentary tells the story of the seventh century merchant who changed world history in 23 years and continues to shape the lives of more than 2 billion people around the world.

The film takes viewers to the ancient Arabian sites where Muhammad's story unfolded, and also into the homes, mosques, and workplaces of some of America's estimated seven million Muslims to discover the many ways they follow Muhammad's example.

A panel discussion with a representative from "KARAMAH" will follow the film screening.

The Los Angeles Times called the film "a candid, thoughtful, flowing, visually stunning film," which was "as timely as documentaries get."

The Washington Post wrote that the film couldn't be more important at a time when "Islam is under attack from within, by fanatics who distort its teachings, and from without, by those seeking a scapegoat for violent hot spots around the world."
