Worried about privacy? You choose how much information you add to your profile, and decide who gets to see it. to close the doors of their privately owned construction company, the married couple did not merely accept their circumstances and wait for things to get better – instead, they made some drastic life changes in an effort to improve their family's situation. First, Tammy and Carlo moved to Maryland where they had no previous ties, and then, both decided to return to school for the first time in nearly a decade. After enrolling at MC, Carlo began a degree program in Legal Studies and Tammy turned her love of photography into a course of study.

"After the [loss of our business], we found our self-confidence severely shaken; in addition to this, we were cognizant of the fact that we were now living far away from our family and friends. This is where Montgomery College has been instrumental in our life. Our individual academic achievement at Montgomery College acted as the catalysts that helped us rediscover our self-confidence. Additionally, MC is also where we have found most of our new friends, people with similar ambitions, motivations and career goals as ourselves. MC has provided us with a renewed and strengthened self-confidence, strong new personal relationships, and a deep and stable foothold to spring into our new career fields."

Tammy adds, "In addition to the daily challenges we face...it is very important to us to maintain vigilant to ensure that we spend enough quality time with our young children. This is often a very difficult task when you are trying to balance your children's wants and needs against the demands of classes, homework and employment obligations."

Mr. and Mrs. Farrugia seem to have been successful in finding this balance – Tammy is working toward the completion of her associate's degree in Photography, and Carlo graduated from MC with a 4.0 GPA, successfully transferring to UMUC's Legal Studies program, and hopes to enroll in law school after earning his Bachelor's degree.

"With both of us working simultaneously toward the completion of our degrees and raising a family, all the while maintaining full-time employment, things can often become quite hectic. But we have found that by working together, covering for each other, and always keeping an eye firmly fixed on our future goals as a family, we have been able to manage all these things quite nicely."
